**Early Adult Formation Class following 7:45 am service (Heyward Hall, Multi-purpose Room)**

Early church adult formation class starts today with breakfast and an episode of *Return to Mayberry, the Andy series*. This class will meet the second Sunday of each month immediately following the 7:45 am service. Dana Turner, David Johnson and Mackie O'Keefe will rotate hosting the class. Based on *The Andy Griffith Show*, this class explores basic values such as character, personal responsibility, honesty, and integrity that were routinely exemplified by the popular television show. Beginning Sunday, November 7, Rev. Brad Wilson will present a series called *Tales from a Madhouse*. *Tales from a Madhouse* is a set of 15-20 minute vignettes of a series of visits to an 18th Century insane asylum. (Sounds fun, huh?) During each visit you, the camera, hear one person who was present at the crucifixion: Pilate's wife, the centurion, Judas, the penitent thief, etc. Each has his or her unique tale to tell. These brief cameos were produced by BBC and feature many of England's finest actors. This is truly a five-star production and most engaging - and artful too! Following we will have an opportunity to chat and reflect on the visit - and why the inmate is there.

**Adult Formation Classes 10:15 am****The Book of Acts (Heyward Hall Multi-purpose Room)**

*Do you wish you knew more about the Bible? Are you afraid to ask what might turn out to be a rather elementary question, so you just don't ask it? Did you know the Bible is filled with stories and*

accounts of people just like us, who had the same challenges and situations facing them as we recognize in our lives today? When you hear someone say, "The Bible is relevant and timeless!" do you think to yourself, "Really? I wish someone would show me how that's true." This class will help us to begin a walk through The Acts of the Apostles. We'll strive for the perfect pace that will encourage newcomers and novices and also challenge those who are further along in their knowledge of the Bible. Come and find out what the 1st century church experienced in the years following Christ's resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit. You'll be surprised how much we have in common with those first Christians, and you'll be encouraged by identifying anew the work of the Spirit in our lives today.
