Adult Christian Formation Offerings for Fall

Sundays 10:15 - 11:00 am

"Waylaid by Light: The Gospel that John Wrote" written by The Rev. Dr. John MacReadie Barr III- This book will serve as the text for an in-depth study of the Book of John. During this class, we will contemplate what the Book of John tells us about Jesus, his character and his personality. We will also explore what Jesus is seeking to do in our lives and what mission he is sending us on. Books will be available. Next Sunday, Oct. 4-Sam Hunter. Discovering the Episcopal Church and St. John's Intended for everyone, this class will explore the Episcopal Church using a text entitled *Your Faith, Your Life: An Invitation to the Episcopal Church* by Jenifer Gamber with Bill Lewellis which is designed to deepen our understanding both of the faith and of our lives. This text is the adult version of the book being used for youth confirmation class. Copies will be available for purchase the first day of class. They cost \$15 each, and there is no reason why couples cannot share a copy. The class will also offer an insight into St. John's and the particular attributes and opportunities of our parish. Those seeking or considering confirmation in the spring will need to participate in this class which will be led by The Rev. Fletcher Montgomery and The Rev. Mary Moore Roberson. "The Reason for God" by Timothy Keller - Why does God allow suffering in the world? Begins Oct. 4. How could a loving God send people to hell? Why isn't Christianity more inclusive?
